Large Grant Process

- ① Nonprofits in the community are invited to submit LOI
- ② 18 nonprofits responded
- ③ 5 nonprofits selected to submit Large Grant Application
- ④ 2 nonprofits selected to present to Board for grant award
- ⑤ Board votes on proposal

2020 – 2021 Funding

- GBRF designates approximately 5% of portfolio to be used to fund large + small grants. For the 2020 – 2021 fiscal year, that is approximately \$42,000.
- Historically, the Large Grant(s) awarded each year range between \$20,000 - \$25,000 and is distributed by the end of the calendar year.
- The remainder of the funds are then used for Small Grants which are distributed in the spring.



PROPOSAL: Designate a greater portion of the total funds available for the 2020 – 2021 fiscal year to Large Grants.

Why increase Large Grants for the current year?



Nonprofits awarded large grant funding are addressing some of the most pressing needs currently effecting our community.



The next few months may be the most challenging faced by our community. As such, funds have the potential to have a greater impact now.

School Day Plus Program

Description: a State of Idaho and local municipality licensed childcare program, currently offering flexible, in-person childcare and online learning support for 550 school-age children at eight locations across the Treasure Valley

Requested amount: \$25,000

Use of funds: provide Financial Assistance at one SDP site in Ada County from January-May 2021

Note: No school district in our service area currently has plans to return to full time in person learning in 2020, and the selection of all remote learning for the spring semester continues to increase. We anticipate without a major shift to in-person learning, the SDP program will be a necessary compliment to traditional learning models for the remainder of the 2020-21 school year.

“Taking Root” – Rapid Rehousing Program

Description: rehouses families with children experiencing homelessness in Ada and Canyon using a Housing First approach

Requested amount: \$10,000

Use of funds: provide 10 single mothers experiencing homelessness and their 30 children with the funding necessary to secure safe and stable permanent housing

Note: There has been a significant increase in the need for this program. There are approximately 250 families on the waitlist for assistance. Historically, there were <150 families on the waitlist during this time of year.

In addition, the federal eviction moratorium due to COVID-19 is scheduled to end Dec 31st of this year. As such, CATCH anticipates the need for assistance with housing will increase significantly in the new year.
